Jeff graduated from the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill with a degree in Journalism. He worked as an Investigative Reporter for the Winston Salem Journal. He later became a Special Investigator with the US Treasury, Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms. After that, he was a Public Relations Manager for the City of Raleigh, a Regional Public Affairs Manager for Weyerhaeuser, and a Public Relations Manager for General

### K4TN-UHF-Antenna Replacement by Ron Perrett K4FZU



The K4TN-UHF antenna project, at the Lithia Pinecrest Fire Department, occurred on Monday December 3rd, beginning around Noon. This was a shared event between Ray Negron - WA6KDW, for his personal repeater, and B.A.R.S. members. It was a beautiful day, but a bit windy. Combine a commercial tower maintenance and antenna crew, three antenna candidates, and some official club observers (repeater committee) and you have a party. This was our long awaited UHF repeater antenna maintenance event, combining removal and replacement of 20 year old antennas.

The process was to remove old VHF dipole-bay antennas and an aged UHF collinear, followed by inspection of mountings, cables and connections - of course you just know one of the tower-top connectors was bad and needed surgery. The efficient antenna crew, two up and two down, worked efficiently in moderate winds to make repairs and clear the tower top. Then, bracket assembly tasks and up with the new antennas. One-by-one they were professionally installed and connected, each receiving a long-life instruction lecture and blessing from the tower-top team. As final antenna cable connections

were completed and sealed, each antenna was given the required RF/VSWR test treatment, with satisfaction was achieved. Completed were the change-out of the K4TN 443.500 MHz UHF antenna, to a new 8dB gain collinear, and replacements for WA6KDW's UHF and 900 MHz systems. A computer model coverage map was generated for expected K4TN coverage, and field verification is ongoing. Before and after testing measurements seem to confirm that the new antenna is about 1 dB better than the old. It is hoped the event will facilitate lots of Amateur QSO's and many years of operational enjoyment.

# 2018 Summer Field Day Results Dana Perrin KM4DTJ

This past Summer, 36 BARS members participated in the ARRL Field Day. We all had a blast. Below are some of the results of our efforts. We were classified as a class 2A station in the West Central Florida Section, part of the Southeast Division. We made 537 contacts and earned 2,780 points. This gave us the following rankings:

98th place overall in Class 2A. There were 328 stations classified 2A.

4th place in the Southeast Division. There were 20 stations classified 2A in the S.E Division.

2nd place in the West Central Florida Section. There were 5 2A stations in the WCF Section.
