# Why I Hate Auto-Tuners

Well, I really don't hate "tuners", I just don't like the way hams use them. Let me explain.

I have been trying to work some really desirable and weak DX stations on SSB this past week. Most of them have been using split frequency and others have been on a single frequency. In either case, there were a plethora (look it up) of stations using auto-tuners right over these rare DX stations. Doing this blocks out the DX station from telling a grateful recipient that they have made a contact. In addition, tuning can block all other stations from trying to make a contact.

There are three solutions:

1. Use a manual tuner and spend some quality time determining the settings for each band you use. Most of time you only need thee for four settings per band from 40-6 meters. Just find a clear frequency, call "is this frequency in use" and wait for a response. If none, tune up using a low power CW signal and record the settings. I usually start just above the lowest frequency in the band, then the middle, and finally near the upper limit. Now when you go to the DX station frequency, just dial in the closest setting. You may want to adjust a setting when trying to answer the DX station. See, no interruptions and everyone is happy.

- 2. Use an auto-tuner but tune at least 3-5KCs above or below the DX station. Of course make sure you are not stepping on anyone especially if they are using split frequencies.
- 3. Do not use a tuner. Of course this most likely requires an SWR of 2:1 or less. No mess no fuss.

Remember using a tuner doesn't make the antenna better, just prevents RF from coming back down the coax.

So, how do I find DX stations. Try the internet: http://www.dxsummit.fi/#/, https://www.dxwatch.com/, https://dxnews.com/, https://www.qrz.com/dxcluster and https://www.ng3k.com/misc/adxo.html.

So the next time you think about using an auto-tuner, take into consideration all those folks trying to make a contact. You will feel better.

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
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#### President's Desk—The final word
